## Newspaper's Front Page Is a Work of Art

In uncertain times for newspapers, readers of The Courier-Journal in Louisville, Ky., might be forgiven for wondering if what they saw when they looked at Friday's front page was a cost-cutting measure: all the words and even the pictures had been hand-drawn, down to the weather box and the captions.

The transformation was the work of the Turkish artist **Serkan Ozkaya**, who has done the same thing to parts or whole pages with the cooperation of several other newspapers around the world (including The New York Times) to create what he describes as cheap, unexpected mass-produced works of art.

The latest effort is the first project of a new nonprofit, noncollecting art organization called **artwithoutwalls**, founded in Louisville by the art collectors **Steve Wilson** and **Laura Lee Brown** to help artists create works in nontraditional settings around the country. One of the next projects will be a collaboration with the Park Avenue Armory in New York.
